



Commentary Reference Guide: Uddhava Gita

Please see notes below for assistance with reading the Uddhava Gita Explained by Michael Beloved and The Heart of the Uddhava Gita by Sajohn Daverly.

Note: Michael Beloved's book includes commentaries on each verse, and the Daverly book includes limited commentaries.

Beloved's Uddhava Gita Explained commentaries begin on p. 10, verse 1, or 1.1 - meaning chapter 1, verse 1.

As you continue reading in Chapter 1, you'll notice the verse numbers, such as 1.2 for Chapter 1, verse 2, etc.

When you reach p.40, Chapter 1 verse 41 (or 1.41), this is where you can also follow Daverly's The Heart of the Uddhava Gita. Here is how they match up:

Beloved Verse 1.41, page 40	matches	Daverly Verse 11.6.41, page 7
Beloved Verse 1.42, page 40	matches	Daverly Verse 11.6.42, page 8
Beloved Verse 1.43 page 41	matches	Daverly Verse 11.6.43, page 9
Beloved Verse 1.47 page 44	matches	Daverly Verse 11.6.47, page 9
Beloved Verse 1.48 page 45	matches	Daverly Verse 11.6.48, page 9-10
Beloved Verse 1.49 pages 45-46	matches	Daverly Verse 11.6.49, page 10

For these six verses only, you will have 2 commentaries: one from Beloved, one from Daverly. You may begin to see a pattern here; where the Beloved number is 1, the Daverly number is 6 because Daverly's commentaries are from a larger collection of Vedic scripture.

You will also notice later that where the Beloved number is 2, the Daverly number is 7. This will continue throughout the books and will become clearer and easier to figure out.

Reminder: In Chapter 1 of the Beloved book, only 6 verses have corresponding commentary in the Daverly book.

Chapter 2 of the Beloved book begins on p. 47, and the corresponding commentaries begin in the Daverly book on p.11. The Daverly version divides the chapters in a different way which can seem confusing.
